Musical students prepare for contest

The students and teachers at Decatur Community High School are getting ready for the regional music festival at the end of the month.

Before spring break, students practiced what they would play and sing in groups and as individuals.

The high school will host the event again this year, said Susan Nelson, vocal teacher. It has been held here for 28 of the last 30 years.

"We have a good facility for hosting this event," she said.

The festival will be held all day on Saturday, March 28.

Activities Association will provide judges and guidelines for the event. This year there are 18 schools from Class 1A to 4A attending. Oberlin, said Mrs. Nelson, will have 42 vocal and instrumental entries, more than many of the other schools. Sarah Bricker is band instructor.

event, said Mrs. Nelson, there will be a pre-contest recital at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, March 24, in the music wing of the high school.


