David Donelle Gaumer

David Donelle Gaumer, 73, a 1953 graduate of Decatur Community High School, died Friday, March 27, 2009, in Lawrence from pancreatic cancer.

He was born Aug. 24, 1935, at Oberlin, the son of Wesley and Fern (Frick) Gaumer. He was a graduate of the University of Kansas and Washburn Law School. After graduation he pursued a brief career in general and corporate law in Denver, then joined a law firm in Kingman for seven years. He accepted a position in 1970 that took him to Washington, D.C., working as Director for Private Sector Development for the Agency for International Development. He returned to Kingman in 1973, where he practiced law until retiring to Lawrence in 2003.

Dave married Mary Rose on June 11, 1960.

He served on the Kanza Bank Board in Kingman for 20 years; was an alumnus of the International Farm Youth Exchange Program having represented Kansas in India and Nepal in 1956. He remained active in the Phi Beta Kappa Honors Society, Kansas Bar Association, Rotary International, Lawrence

Memorial Hospital Auxiliary, and the JOY coffee club.

Survivors include his wife, Mary; and three sons, David and Tammy Gaumer, Allen, Texas; and Dan and Sonja Gaumer, and Doug and Kathy Gaumer, Lawrence; seven grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents; a sister, Jean Ann Kump; and a nephew, John Kump.

A memorial service will be at 11 a.m. on Friday, at Trinity Episcopal Church, in Lawrence.

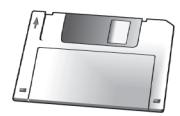

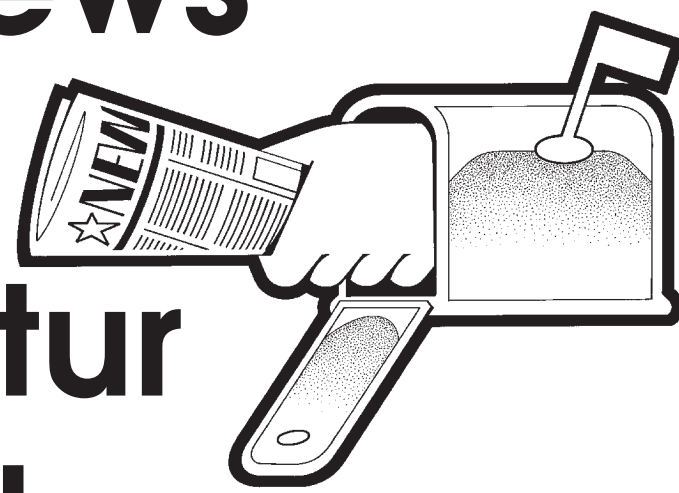
