- Photos of early high school championship athletic teams.
- A basketball uniform from the 1927-1928 school year.
- Land survey equipment from C.H. Starrett, early 1900's.
- Prehistoric fossils from the short-legged rhinoceros and mastodon.
- The first Lenora Post office, from 1874, which is about 30 boxes that were in the Lenora grocery store.
- Pictures and information on Ida Walker, a woman from Norton County that was elected to the Kansas House of Representatives in 1929.
- Fashion from the 1920's for a Saturday night out on the town, including a beaver-pelt top-hat.
- Photographs memorabilia from the Civil War, the Spanish-American War, World War I, World War II and the Korean War.
- Photographs and information about Maxine Carr, a World War II Navy nurse.
- "Life Goes to War" magazines, from 1942 to 1945.
- Photographs and information on the State Sanatorium, built in the early 1900's, a tuberculosis hospital outside of Norton.
- Eyeglasses and an eyeglass salesman's traveling case from the late 1800's.
- The first television set in Norton County. The screen is 5 inches, it weighs about 40 pounds, and was of course in black-and-white.
- Stereopticans (early forerunners of today's ViewMasters), a radio and a Victrola.
- The first radio built in Norton County, by the Sebelius family and used in Almena. The radio was also like a ham radio in that signals could be sent out from it.
- Cameras, stereo-cameras and plates.
- An autoharp and a trumpet.
- A family bible from 1875.
- The oldest chair in Norton County, whose legs were chopped off because it stood too tall for its owner.
- A collection of Lions Club pins from various meetings and conventions, from 1967 to 1999.
- Early furniture, one piece still in its original upholstery.
- Pictures of a tornado that went through the county in 1909.
- A banner that was flown in the 1912 Women's Suffrage parade in New York City.
- Early pharmacological items.
- A story and fragment pieces of the meteor that crashed in Norton County in 1948.
- The last print plates from the Lenora newspaper.
- A Mimeograph machine.
- The Norton Daily Telegram on microfiche, from 1930 to 1955.
- A barbed-wire collection, and tools.
- A hand corn planter.
- Ross Hixon's pencil collection, more than 9,000 pencils and pens.
- A model of a hay stacker, built and patented by George Edward Linnell, who was from Norton County.
- The first dispatch radio in Norton County, which has 2 channels.
- Property deeds from 1874 to 1932.
- A display and separate room for the Lebeau archaeological dig site, where artifacts from 1,000 to 1,400 A.D. were found.
- And for the kids, there is the Circus Room, full of circus animals and equipment.

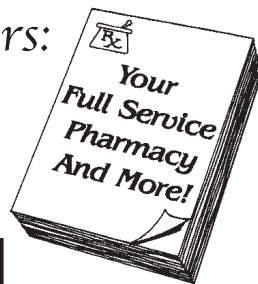
