Corrections

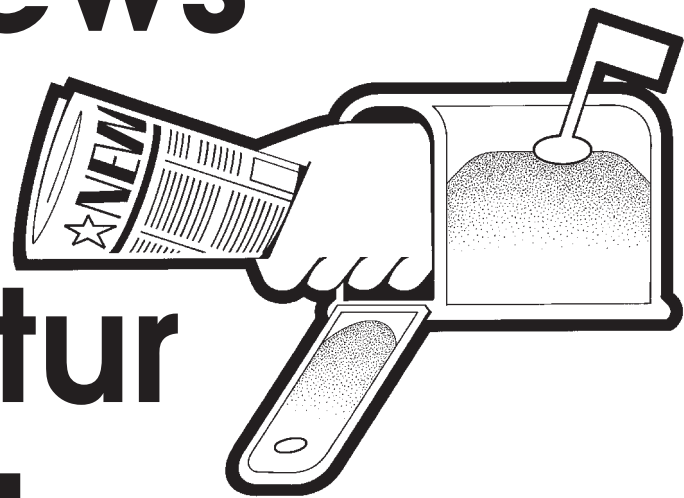
