Man's dog kills rabid skunk

Jim Bryan, who lives just east of the third rabid skunk found in the the Oberlin Cemetery, reported that his boxer dog killed a skunk which wandered into his yard.

He said that his dog attacked and killed the skunk. He took the skunk to Countryside Veterinary Clinic and it was sent to Kansas State Veterinary Diagnostic Lab for testing. The test on the skunk came back positive for rabies.

Mr. Bryan said that his dog was given a booster shot since his shots were current. However, he will need to be watched and monitored for 45 days to make sure that the pet is safe for the public and that it doesn't show any signs of rabies.


