Shortly thereafter, they left Frontier County for Oregon to join her husband's four brothers and mother, who had left Nebraska earlier. They returned to Nebraska two years later and were tenants on three different farms from 1937 until 1950, when they bought the 160 acres where they lived until his death on Dec. 29, 1972.

After her husband's death, she moved to McCook and worked at the Burns Lab until she retired.

She married Robert Leitner on April 27, 1989, and they lived in Oberlin. Her husband died in 1996.

She moved to Willow Ridge in Mc-Cook in February 2000 and to the 2009, at the Good Samaritan Center Prairie Senior Living Complex in Colby in January 2003.
