# **Go and Make Disciples By Pastor Chris Nelson**

### **Evangelical Covenant Church, Oberlin**

Oberlin Covenant Church have been spending some time thinking about the appearances that Jesus made to his disciples after he was raised from the dead. As it turns out, these stories seem to have at least one thing in common: When Jesus appears he commissions his disciples to spread the good news. He sends them out to tell others about his death and resurrection.

In John 20 it happens on the evening of Easter Sunday. Jesus tells his followers, "As the Father has sent me, I am sending you" (v. 21). Or the way Luke tells the story, "repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in (Jesus') name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things" ishing trip, and in a special conversation with Peter sheep... Feed my sheep" (John 21:15-17). commissioning scenes is what we have come to call the "Great Commission." Read Matthew 28:16-20. Perhaps we'll start with ourselves.

In these last several weeks since Easter, we at the In short, Jesus tells his followers to "Go and make disciples..." (v. 19). Multiply. Spread the good news. As I have called you, go and call others.

Yet sometimes we miss the full significance of what it means to "make disciples" - or to be a disciple, for that matter. In my own branch of the Christian family tree, we have often emphasized conversion and belief - or as it's often said, "inviting Jesus into your heart" - but failed to follow through on the whole-life commitment that true discipleship entails.

True discipleship has less to do with whether you believe the right theologies (however important these may be) than with whether you are following the right Master. Disciples of Jesus follow him and learn from (24:47-48). Later the disciples encounter Jesus on a him throughout their lives. According to Jesus, his disciples will "take up their cross and follow (him)" he says again, "Feed my lambs... Take care of my (Matthew 16:24). That is to say, the way Jesus lived and died (and lived again!) is the pattern for our living Perhaps the most famous of these post-Easter and dying, day in and day out, our whole lives long. "Go, therefore, and make disciples," Jesus says.
