Golfers send three to compete in Atwood

The Decatur Community high golf team took three boys on Saturday, May 2, because seven of the 10 golfers were attending State Speech.

Colby took first with 323, followed by Goodland with 350; Hoxie, 362; Atwood, 380; and Quinter, 449. Oberlin, Brewster, and Triplains did not field full teams.

Golfing for Oberlin were Jordan Tally, 47-44 for 91; Garrett Berry, 47-47, 94; and Nathan Simonsson shooting a 43-53 to make 96.

The Decatur Community high golf team placed 11 out of 14 teams on Monday, May 4, at Hays for the TMP golf invitational, shooting a 394 as a team for the day.

Colby won the tournament with a 335; then Hays JV, 344; Goodland, 354; Russell, 363; Trego, 363; Scott City, 369; TMP, 370; Norton, 390; Phillipsburg, 392; Larned, 392; Oberlin, 394; Hays "C", 446; TMP JV, 532; and Ellis, NTS.

Coach Ahlberg said, "This was a good experience on a fine golf course. Smoky Hill Country Club is a championship golf course. Garrett had his best performance of the season to date. Our team is improving."

Scoring for Oberlin were Garrett Berry, fifth place medalist, with a 41-43 for an 84 overall; Nathan Simonsson, 50-45, 95; Jacob Larue, 50-50, 100; and Chris Larson, 55-60 for a 115.

The Decatur Community high golf team placed sixth out of 10 at the Colby Invitational last Thursday, shooting a 393.

Colby won the tournament shooting a 318; followed by Goodland, 349; Scott City, 360; Norton, 365; Atwood, 372; Oberlin, 393; Colby JV, 395; Oakley, 408; Brewster, NTS; and Triplains, no team score.
