Back in those days there were still music videos on MTV and the fashions came from there. Some of those fashions included stonewashed jeans that a person would roll and peg leg at the bottom.


Lots of guys quoted lines from their favorite movies too, like "Top Gun, "Fast Times at Ridgemont High" and "Young Guns".
