Eighth-grade girls tie for first place

"We showed improvement today and we were respectable," said Coach Dick Ahlberg.

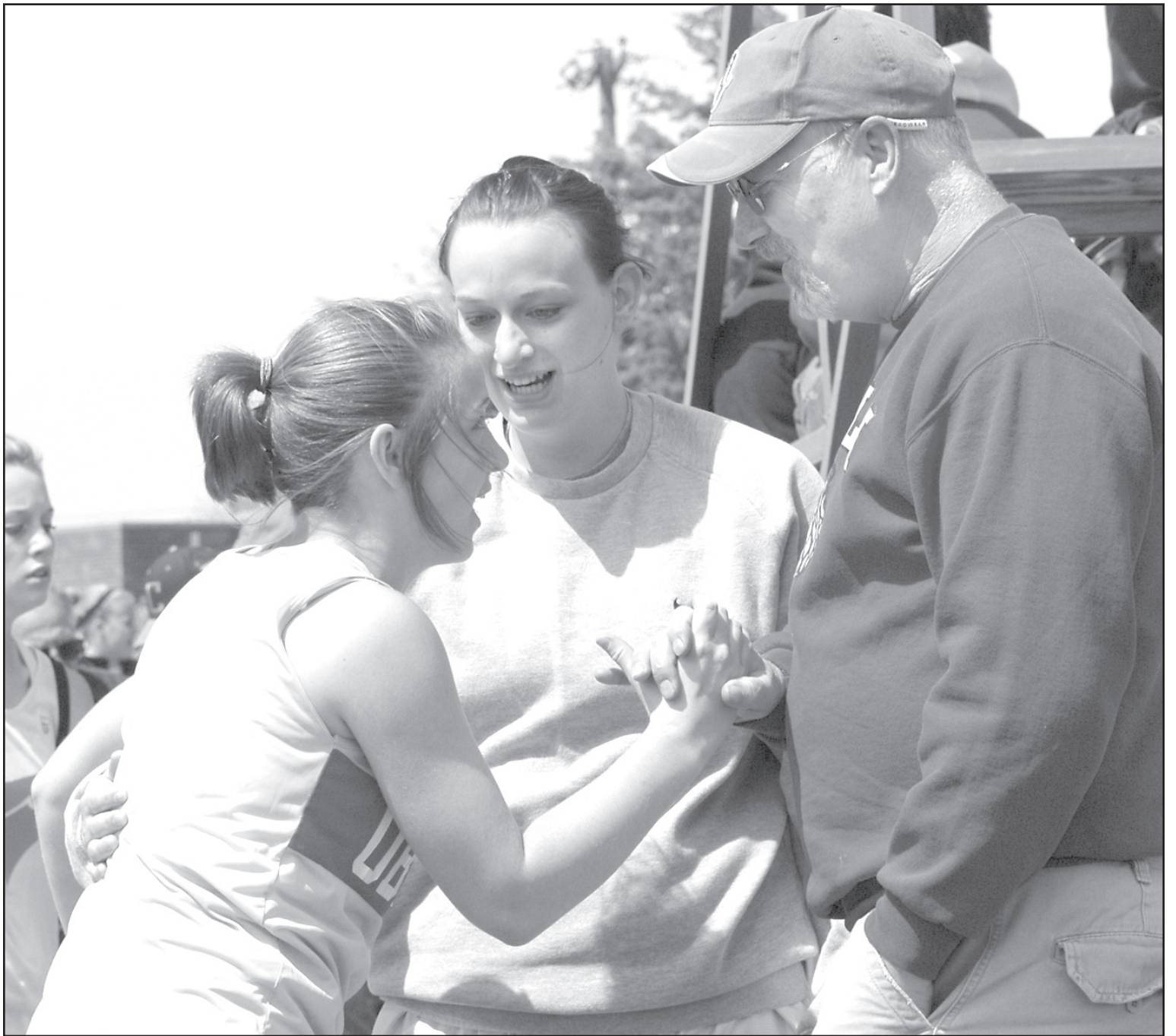
