

# **Dry Bones** By Pastor Chris Nelson **Evangelical Covenant Church, Oberlin**

This week, as the fifty days of resurrection season be worth living. give way to Pentecost and the gift of the Holy Spirit, one text is on my mind that brings the two of them together. Read Ezekiel 37:1-14.

I have to confess that the pages of Ezekiel's book are not among the most worn in my Bible like the Psalms or the gospels or Paul's letters – parts of the book are certainly among the most bizarre and shocking in the Bible — but Ezekiel's vision of the valley of the dry bones is worth returning to again and again.

It all begins when the Spirit of the Lord carries this horrendous sight, the Lord poses a question: "Can of his Holy Spirit. Death and despair met their match these bones live?" It's a seemingly ridiculous thing when Jesus emerged from the tomb on Easter Sunday, sign of despair, dead ends, and life that has ceased to remaking us in the image of his risen Son.

But that's before the Spirit of the Lord gets involved. At the Lord's word, bone comes together to bone, and flesh to sinew, and as spirit or breath enters into them those corpses turn once again into living, breathing human beings, complete with hopes and dreams for life.

Then the Lord teaches Ezekiel a lesson - about Israel and also about all of us who live in the world after Easter: There is no end to hope so long as the Spirit of the Lord is at work. There is no dead end in Ezekiel far away to a forgotten battlefield littered life, no life without meaning that cannot be restored with the bones of the dead. As the prophet takes in through the resurrection power of Jesus and the gift


