Full house puts City Council on center stage ordinance to allow the administrator

c.haynes@nwkansas.com The Oberlin City Council was center stage on Thursday when it held its meeting in the Morgan Theater at The Gateway rather than one of the usual meeting rooms.

Since the facility had several events booked and employees were setting up for the annual alumni banquet Saturday, the council sat on the stage of the theater while City Administrator Austin Gilley and others

stood or sat in the audience. Mr. Gilley talked about an ordinance City Attorney Steve Hirsch had drafted that would regulate and allow golf carts on city streets. He said that he had asked Mr. Hirsch to add sections for all terrain-vehicles. work-site utility vehicles and micro utility vehicles to avoid having to go back and write separate ordinances for them later.

Some of the provisions are that the vehicles cannot be operated on state highways, including U.S. 83 and U.S. 36; the driver must be 17 or older and have a valid license and insurance; and no one under 12 ride in them. The vehicles would need normal car-like accessories provides money for both.

including seats and seat belts and could be used only during the day. They would need to be inspected and permitted each year.

The council decided that all terrain vehicles will need to have a flag on the back, anyone under 18 must wear a helmet and the driver must wear eye protection. All-terrain vehicles need regular seats but seat belts are not required.

For work-site and micro utility vehciles, the regulations are the same as for golf carts but some might be required to have a flag. If there is any doubt as to what type of vehicle it is, the ordinance says, the police chief has the final say.

However, since the state law on such vehicles doesn't change until July 1, Mr. Hirsch advised the council to table the ordinance until the law allows it. "Don't do anything until July,"

he advised. In other business, the council

Mr. Gilley said he would hire Connie Grafel, who currently holds a joint position with the city and the Economic Development Corp.
