## Professor speaks to Rotary Club

Don Steeples, a distinguished professor of geophysics and senior vice provost at the University of Kansas, entertained members of the Oberlin Rotary Club with a talk about his research when they met at The Gateway on June 9.

He was introduced by Chuck Frickey, program chair. Dr. Steeples has earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Kansas State University. He received master's and doctoral degrees from Stanford University.

He talked about "stupid seismic experiments he has done," involving all kinds of rigs and fixtures, including farm machinery and weaponry of different calibers. Many of the active seismic tests he experimented with were for locating faults and cavities in the earth. He said these experiments have been useful in locating water and oil underground.

Data received from as far as 100 feet underground has been obtained through his many experiments. Dr. Steeples began his research in 1975 while trying to discover ground water. He said that many of his jobs were done for large oil and water companies.
