

Little League team stays undefeated

LITTLE LEAGUE
In Little League play last week, Custom Trophy downed Stanley Hardware 21-6 to stay undefeated with a 3-0 record.

Farmers Bank and Trust edged The Bank 5-4 for its first victory of the season, then The Bank overcame Stanley 10-1 to stay in second place with a 3-1 record.

On Monday, it was to be Custom Trophy versus Farmers Bank in the opener and against The Bank in the second game of the evening. The closing matchup was to be Farmers against Stanley.
