Robert L. Crabill, 87, a native of Norcatour, died July 26, 2009, at Hodgeman County Long Term Care Center in Jetmore.
He was born May 26, 1922, northeast of Norcatour in the Long Branch community, the son of Fred and Jessie (Patterson) Crabill. He attended rural school at the Long Branch school and graduated in May, 1939, from Norcatour Rural High School.

Survivors include a son, Robert and Michele; two daughters, Laurie and David Dansel, and Julie and Alan Ochs, all of Jetmore; and 11 grandchildren.
He was also preceded in death by two sisters, Gloria Kwartz and Genevieve Anderson.
Funeral services were held at the United Methodist Church in

Jetmore on July 30 with Dr. Dyton Owens, and the Rev. Kirk Larson officiating. Burial was at the Jetmore Cemetery.
