The Oberlin City Police worked this call:

• Arrested 18-year-old Anthony Heflin Monday after investigating a break-in, theft and criminal damage at D&M Sinclair on U.S. 36. Police Chief Wade Lockhart said Mr. Heflin hadn't seen a judge yet, but the most likely charges will be for burglary, theft and criminal damage.

He said he received a call at 6 a.m. Monday reporting the incident. He discovered that someone had forced entry through the drive-in window at A&W. Cigarettes and lottery tickets were taken from the store, but later recovered. Chief Lockhart said he didn't know how much the items added up to.

The thief apparently tried to break into the safe, but didn't succeed. The chief said there was quite a bit of damage on the inside of the station.

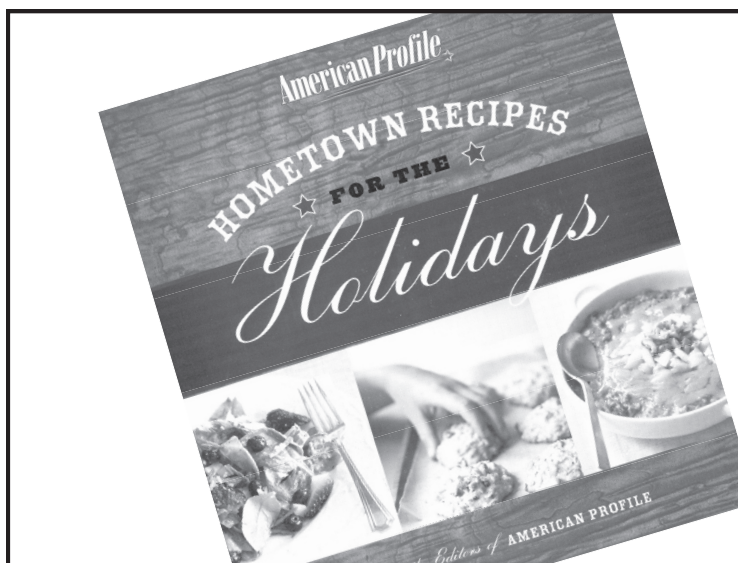

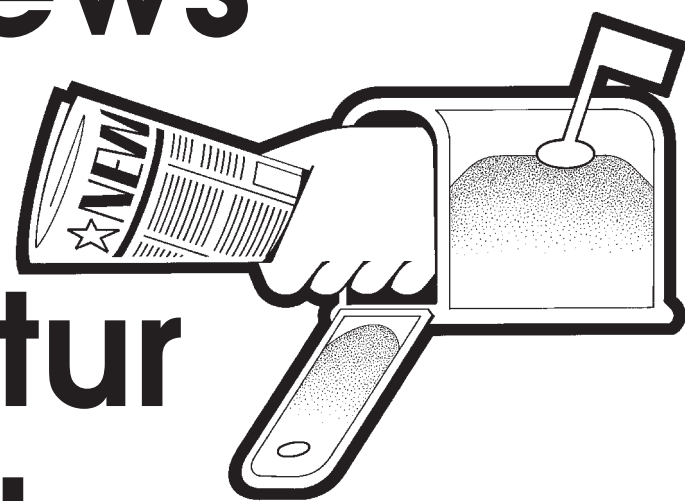
