Oberlin Red Devils beat Plainville 30-0 for second win

The Oberlin Red Devils celebrated their Homecoming in fine style Friday night, plucking the Plainville Cardinals 30-0.

Oberlin won the opening coin toss but deferred to the visitors, who took the kickoff but couldn't go anywhere. Then Oberlin's Nolan Peters recovered a fumble his brother Toby helped create.

With good field position, Oberlin didn't need many plays to march down the field and score what ended up being the only touchdown of the first quarter — and the only one the Red Devils would need.

Quarterback Wiley Farr made a 16-yard run across the goal line with 9:09 left in the period to put Oberlin up 6-0 over the Cardinals.

Farr also ran the successful two-point conversion to make the score 8-0.

Later in the quarter, Keithen Fortin recovered a Plainville fumble, but Oberlin was not able to score and turned over the ball on downs.

Plainville made a long, but unsuccessful, drive and Oberlin again took the ball on downs near the end of the quarter.

In the second quarter, the teams battled back and forth, but a face mask penalty and Plainville interception hurt the Red Devils. Plainville also was unsuccessful in scoring.

A Plainville player was injured in the second quarter, but came back in the game with a heavily taped leg in the third quarter.

Oberlin still led 8-0 as the half-time ceremonies got underway.

The Red Devils got the kickoff and took no time in getting down to the red zone. Farr apparently ran the

ball in from the eight-yard line for a touchdown, but while one official called it in, a second said no and the touchdown turned into a fourth-and-one situation.

Farr just did it again, taking the ball for a one-yard run for Oberlin's second touchdown. The two-yard conversion pass from Farr to T. Peters was good and Oberlin was ahead 16-0.

The entire third quarter was played on the Plainville side of the field, but Oberlin was not able to score again.

Late in the third, Oberlin punted on third down, but the ball was fumbled by Plainville and Nolan Peters picked up the loose pigskin.

As the fourth quarter started, Oberlin was close to the end zone, but a penalty call pushed the Red Devils back to the 17.

Farr again took the ball, and this time he ran untouched for 20 yards into the end zone for Oberlin's third touchdown.

He also ran the two-point conversion.

With something over 11 minutes left in the game, Oberlin led 24-0. Neither team was able to make much headway.

Oberlin had an almost interception on Plainville but two Red Devils got tangled up and the ball got away.

The Red Devils lost a touchdown bid when a holding penalty negated a run across the goal line. Other penalties pushed the Red Devils out of scoring range and a Plainville interception put the ball back in the visitor's hands.

Then, Daniel Jordan intercepted a Plainville pass. With less than two minutes remaining, Farr threw a 19-yard touchdown pass to T. Peters to take the score to 30-0.

The two-point try was no good and Oberlin's record stands at 2-1.

Coach J.D. Johnson said he thought his team had done well, especially with all the hoopla of homecoming.

"We played well in parts, but there are parts we need to work on," Coach Johnson said after the game. "We are capable of playing much better ball than we did."

Oberlin had nine first downs, eight rushing and one by penalty. The team passed 13 times with three completions, including one for a touchdown for 35 yards.

The Decatur County boys ran 51 plays for 288 yards on the ground, compared to Plainville's 29 runs for 46 yards. Each team had two interceptions.

The Red Devils are slated to play the Rawlins County Buffaloes at 7 p.m. Friday in Atwood.
