This week, Mrs. Wurm and Managing Editor Kimberly Davis have decided to try again. Several photos have been selected to run on this page.

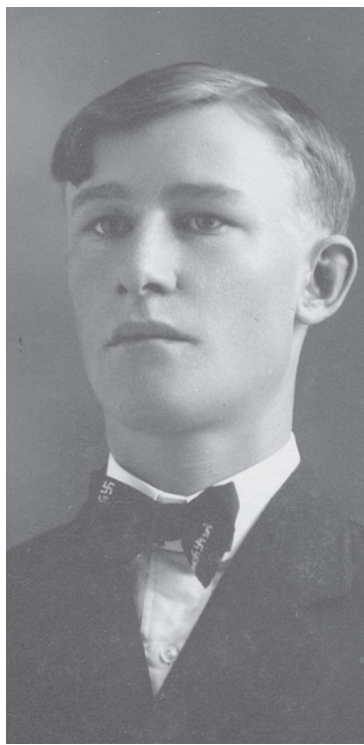
In the top left corner is Picture No. 1 of a woman wearing glasses. The picture was taken by Dyer and the frame around her face is in the shape of a heart.
