Clarence Ray "Nick" Nicholson, 80, formerly of Oberlin, died Oct. 28, 2009, in Salina. He was born June 21, 1929, in Tulsa, Okla., the son of Ray and Helen (Urban) Nicholson. He was reared in Oberlin and attended Oberlin schools. After moving to Salina, he started in business with his father at Nicholson and Son Motors, then was owner of Nick's Pawn and Nick's Marine. He was also the former owner of the Peacock Lounge. He was a lifetime member of the National Rifle Association, was a skeet shooter and trap shooter with a 27-yard handicap.
