TAX REQUIREMENTS for airport construction project

City needs \$18,500 annually to service the USDA Rural Development loan and recovery bonds totaling \$250,000. Three mills covers the \$18,500.

A home valued at \$50,000 is assessed by the appraiser's office at 11.5%.

You pay taxes on the assessed value of \$5,750. Take that amount times the combined total tax rate for county, school and city which totals 208.263 mills.

Total tax amounts to \$1197 - \$46 (statewide deduction to adjust residential property tax regarding school finance) = \$1152 in taxes for this coming year.

Raising 3 more mills next year brings the tax rate up to 211.263 and the total tax bill would be \$1,169 or \$17 higher.

The county appraiser has indicated that the majority of homes in Oberlin are valued at less than \$50,000.

What happens if the proposed ordinance is passed?

1. It will prohibit the city of Oberlin from spending any federal, state, city or private funds for the purpose of studying, planning, or building a new runway or acquiring any additional land at the Airport.

2. This will prohibit any and all improvements to the Oberlin Airport for 10 years. Not one year, not two years, but 10 years.

What about improvements to the present runway that are required by the FAA?

The current FAA mandated "improvements" will shorten the current runway by 300 feet, making it one of the shortest in Northwest Kansas.

Does that mean that no private or donated money can be spent to make any studies about the airport?

The ordinance is very specific in that it prohibits even studying anything regarding improving the airport and that would be in effect for 10 years.

When I signed the petition, why didn't they tell me about the 10 year freeze on spending any money, public or private for an airport expansion?

A lot of other folks are asking the same question.
