

Boys fall twice

The Oberlin Red Devils fell 62-43 to Norton at home on Monday and then were edged 54-53 by Rawlins County in Atwood on Friday.

On Monday, the Norton Bluejays were in town and they turned out to be a bunch of tough birds.

Oberlin started out well, with Wiley Farr and Dakota Soderlund combining for 15 points in the first quarter while Norton put up 12. However, the Bluejays took the lead before the half. After that it was all Norton as the Blue Jays outscored Oberlin 18-11 in the second quarter, 14-7 in the third and 18-10 in the fourth.

Both teams had lots of opportunities for free throws, as Norton went to the charity line 21 times and sank a dozen for 57 percent while the Red Devils put down only four of 14 for 29 percent.

at the half. In the third quarter, Atwood was able to outscore Oberlin by one point, 18-17. Since both teams scored 10 in the last quarter, that one point was the difference in the game.

The Decatur Community High junior varsity boys basketball team beat the Buffaloes 55-50 on Friday in Atwood but lost 42-29 to Norton last Monday in Oberlin.

Oberlin came out strong Friday, hitting 21 points in the first quarter to Atwood's 9.

The Buffaloes came back in the second period and out scored Oberlin 15-13 to cut Oberlin's lead to 34-24.

In the third and fourth quarters, Atwood again out hit Oberlin 14-10 and 12-11, but it wasn't enough to take away the Red Devils' victory.

in the final quarter, the visitors hit 14 to the home team's 8 for the victory.

The Red Devils hit eight of 14 free throws for 57 percent. They didn't give the Blue Jays many chances at the charity line, but the Jays were able to sink three of six for 50 percent.

Girls team loses to Atwood, Norton

The Decatur Community High girls lost a pair of close basketball games last week, falling 33-31 to Norton on Monday at home and 33-27 to Rawlins County on Friday in Atwood.

The Norton game started off close, with Oberlin edging the Lady Bluejays 12-11 in the first quarter, then having a poor second quarter. Norton outscored the Oberlin girls 11-5 to take a 22-17 lead at the half.

Oberlin had a poor third quarter, scoring just 5 points while Norton put up 7 to pull ahead 29-22. In the fourth quarter, however, Oberlin's Adrienne Pauls hit six out of eight free throws to help the team put up 9 points to Norton's 4. That was one basket short, however, and the Blue Jays won 33-31.
