Hazel Irene Fields, 94, a former owner of the Selden Cafe, died Thursday, Feb. 25, 2010, at the Prairie Senior Living Complex in Colby.
She was born Feb. 19, 1916, in Republic, the daughter of John Richard and Arvilla (Plotts) Anderson. She was reared on a farm northeast of Colby and attended Otterbourne Country School.
She married John Vernon Fields on Nov. 24, 1934, at the Rawlins County courthouse in Atwood. They lived on a farm northeast of Colby before moving to Saratoga, Wyo., where she cooked for a ranch. The family moved to Selden, where she and her husband operated the Selden Cafe. Later, they moved to Colby, and she was a housekeeper for the Cooper Hotel until retiring in 1978.

She was preceded in death by her husband on March 29, 1991; a son, Ray Vernon Fields; and infant daughter, Judith Ann Fields; three brothers, Warren, Marvin and Eldon Anderson, and two sisters, Norma Jean Thompson and Nida Anderson.
Survivors include a son, Richard and Dixie Fields of Menlo, six grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.
