Melvin F. Beneda

Melvin F. Beneda, 87, a brother-in-law of Phyllis McCartney of Oberlin, died Friday, April 23, 2010, at the Holton Community Hospital.

He was born Sept. 17, 1922, in Almena, the son of James and Mata (Jorgensen) Beneda, Jr. He attended Lone Star Country School and was a 1940 graduate of Decatur Community High School.

He married Avis L. Armstrong on Dec. 28, 1941, in Oberlin. He served in the Army Air Corps during World War II. He was stationed at Walker Air Base in Walker, and later served in the China-Burma-India Theater. He was a Staff Sergeant and crew chief on a B-29.

He owned Chaffee Park Standard in Denver and later worked at Mountain Bell before retiring in 1984. He was a member of Liberty

Lodge Masonic Lodge and Temples Order of the Eastern Star, both of Denver, and the First United Methodist Church in Holton.

Survivors include his wife, Avis, Holton; four daughters, Judith and Don Swisher, Holton; Janette and Bill Smitham, Denver; Janell and Niles Riese,

Grand Rapids, Mich.; and Jerrilee and Gerry Bender, Inola, Okla.; five grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents and a sister, Alene Beneda. Graveside services were held at 1 p.m. Tuesday at the Oberlin Cemetery.
