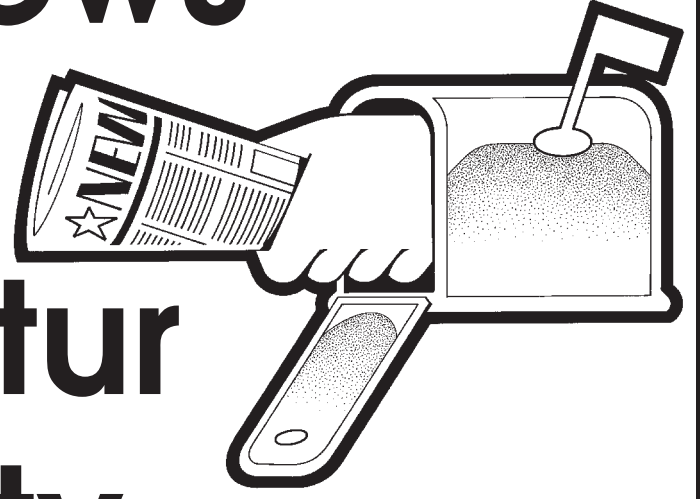
Funeral services and burial were held May 13, 2010, at Chapel Hill Cemetery, Littleton, Colo.
