 Ona Marie Scrivner, 87, a former resident of the Lyle community, died Aug. 18, 2009, in Missouri.
 She was born Aug. 7, 1922, to William and Edna Carfield at their rural home near the Red Willow/Decatur County line. She attended school in Danbury, Neb.
 She married Bernie James Scrivner on Aug. 29, 1942. He joined the army so their early days were spent in Big Springs, Texas, and Liberal. After his discharge, they moved to Lyle, where they farmed and raised cattle. In the early 1960s, they bought the 36 Motel in Norton, which they operated several years before moving back to their farm at Lyle. After her husband's death in the late 1970s, she bought a home in Oberlin, where she worked at the Good Samaritan Home. After retiring in 1991, she moved to Missouri where her children lived. In 2001, she moved into Brookview Care Facility.
 She was a member of the Lyle United Methodist Church, Liberty Star Club, Women's Society for Christian Service, and American Legion Auxiliary. She taught Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and was a 4-H club leader.
 Survivors include two children, Lynn and Martha; five grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren and several sisters and brothers, Kenneth, Micky, Agnes, Margie, Elma, Elmer, Elenora, Pauline, Franky, Billy; and Charollette.
 Graveside inurnment services will be held at 11 a.m. on Saturday at the Wilsonville Cemetery. A memorial service will follow at the Lyle Community Center.
