Area man helps plug well leak off Louisiana

karen.k@nwkansas.com Joe Caldart of St. Francis was horrified by all the attention. You'd think he'd plugged that rogue offshore well in the Gulf all by him-

The retired plumber overnight became a sought-after guest for national television.

He told Fox News no. He told CNN no. He told NBC no.

It all started when a writer for the Christian Science Monitor learned that he was one of the guys who had helped come up with a design for the containment cap for the outof-control gusher off the shore of Louisiana.

Mr. Caldart, who calls himself a reserved, quiet guy, got phone call after phone call asking for information and requests to be a guest on national television.

"I was just one of 10, maybe 15, plumbers who turned in designs which were all similar," he said.

He's been called "Joe the Plumber," but he is not the famed Joe who made the headlines during the presidential election. He says he has been a plumber since he was 15, though.

He and hundreds of other guys, he said, all realized that plugging the gusher was a matter of "plain, common plumber sense."

When they started showing the break in the pipe, said his wife Jamie, he shook his head and said, "Why don't they just plug it?"

He started making sketches of ways to stop the oil spill, which began at the middle of May. He talked to an engineer with BP, the international oil company which owns the well, in Houston. He was told that the company wasn't interested in stopping the leak but wanted to harvest the oil. However, the engineer said he could submit his drawings to Deepwater Horizon Response, a joint command for BP and more than a dozen federal agencies involved in the disaster.

In the meantime, the spill was

getting worse.

Deepwater sent back a form on which Mr. Caldart detailed the design, equipment needed and the cost for his idea. He filled out the form and sent it back. He was told the idea had been transferred to the logistic office for review.

Three days later, he called BP and a secretary answered the phone. She put her hand over the mouthpiece, then told the other person in the room that he was calling about the design. Mr. Caldart could hear the response which was, "him and every other small-town idiot!"

Mr. Caldart said he had three

based on the way a plumber would cap a sewer break, only on a much bigger scale.

The first design was to install a hydraulic piston on the containment cap with barbs to hold the cap in place. The second drawing, after the pipe was cut, was to internally thread the pipe and put the cap in place by screwing it on. The third drawing was like a fire hydrant with the top flange with an internal seal bolted on the blowout preventer.

The equipment used to stop the leak, Mr. Caldart said, is a steel cap and underneath it is the internal seal - a design he had drawn on May 25.

He thought he had been brushed off, so he said he started e-mailing everybody his design. One reached the desk of Dr. Robert Bea, a University of California at Berkeley petroleum engineer, who, when called by the Monitor writer, said Mr. Caldart's plan was very similar to the successful capping opera-

"Kevin Costner and James Cameron had tried to help and they didn't get anywhere," Mr. Caldart said, "so Ididn't think I had a chance. People think plumbers don't know more than scientists."

However, he added, by that time, the scientists were thinking about plugging the hole with garbage

"Can you imagine what that would have been like," he said, 'when it broke loose and blew tires and garbage all over the coast?"

Mr. Caldart said he is no hero. There were other plumbers who sent in designs, and the response team probably took "nuts and bolts" from all of them. However, he thinks that especially used equipment. BP should recognize all the people

We are all a bunch of plumbers working together to help the stop the leak," he said. "Stopping along the road, ready to sell. the leak was the main concern of everyone."

Mr. Caldart said he didn't believe there had ever been as much pressure in the well that BPhad claimed.

As of last week, the oil had been where. Mr. Caldart said that BP hadn't decided whether to close the well or release the pressure and continue surface containment efforts. They are talking about filling the pipe with drilling mud, he said, but that was tried before on another well and it didn't work.
