The Decatur County sheriff gave is split. putting \$20,000 into the insurance agreement for the new Golden Age Center and Sunflower Cinema. It's going to cost \$8,600 this year, he said.

He said he thought last year the county's share was 40 percent. The insurance went down a little compared to last year, he added.
