Any person found guilty of violating any provision of this Code or Ordinances of the City may be assessed court costs for the amount of any court reporter or stenographic charges, fees or mileage of witnesses, expenses incurred in the service of process or cost of publication of this and such other charges as are authorized by the statutes of the State of Kansas and in addition thereto, court costs on each count shall be the same amount as that charged by the State of Kansas in traffic

 $SECTION 2. \ This is a charter ordinance and$ shall take effective sixty-one (61) days after final publication unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed and a referendum held on the ordinance as provided in Article 12, Section 5, Subdivision (c)(3) of the Constitution of Kansas, in which case the ordinance shall become effective if approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and publication in the official city newspaper.
