OBERLIN WAS A POPULAR shopping place in the 1950's and 1960's. Oberlin Mills (right) owned by H. Q. Banta and his son, Howard, was a thriving business during the early days of Oberlin. It was located west of S. Penn Avenue and the original building later burned. The name was later changed to Oberlin Milling Company.
