Charter Ordinance No. 14

A CHARTER ORDINANCE CHANGING

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERN-ING BODY OF THE CITY OF OBERLIN,

SECTION 1. City Code Section 10-104 is

A. Any person found guilty of violating any provision of this Code or Ordinances of the City may be assessed court costs for the amount of any court reporter or stenographic charges, fees or mileage of witnesses, expenses incurred in the service of process or cost of publication of this and such other charges as are authorized by the statutes of the State of Kansas and in addition thereto, court costs that charged by the State of Kansas in traffic

B. All ordinances in conflict herewith are

SECTION 2. This is a charter ordinance and shall take effective sixty-one (61) days after a referendum is filed and a referendum held on the ordinance as provided in Article 12, Section 5, Subdivision (c)(3) of the Constitution of Kansas, in which case the ordinance shall ecome effective if approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and ublication in the official city newspaper

PASSED BY THE GOVERNING BODY, NOT LESS THAN TWO-THIRDS OF THE MEMBER-ELECT VOTING IN FAVOR THEREOF, AND APPROVED BY THE MAYOR this 19th day of August 2010.


