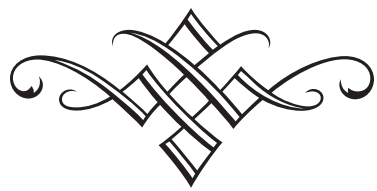
After high school, he worked on oil rigs before attending school in Denver to become a heating, cooling, and ventilation technician.

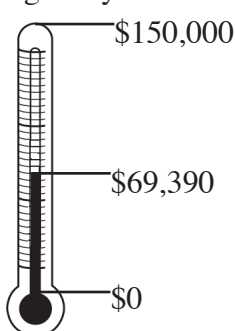
