


Girl signs to play ball in Nebraska

The Oberlin eighth-grade boys basketball team continued its winning ways on Thursday while the seventh graders suffered their first loss of the season, dropping a game to Oakley at home.

The seventh graders fell 22-18 a 10-8 lead. to the Plainsmen while the eighth grade won 36-22

While the seventh grade took an early 4-2 lead in the first quarter, the young Red Devils were not able to maintain their momentum. That allowed Oakley shut them down 9-0 in the second quarter, giving the visitors an 11-4 lead at the half.

In the third quarter, Oberlin came back to outscore Oakley 9-4, but the Plainsmen still lead 15-13. Oakley upped the lead by two re in the fourth period by outscoring the Red Devils 7-5.
