The Oberlin Red Devils boys basketball team beat the St. Francis Indians 80-67 on Friday in St. Francis but fell 53-49 to the Hill City Ringnecks at home last Tuesday.

The boys now have a 3-3 record. Last Tuesday, both teams scored 14 points in the first quarter. In the second, Hill City was able to outscore Oberlin 8-5 for a 22-19 lead at the half.
