Dole Harold Metcalf, 81, a retired Harlan Township farmer, died Wednesday, Jan. 19, 2011, at the Decatur County Hospital in Oberlin.

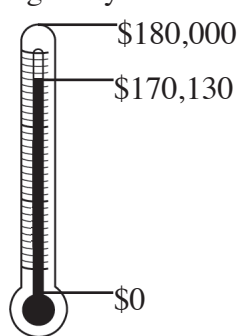
