He worked for Halliburton for 25 years retiring as a field service manager. After retiring, he established RAW Consulting, servicing the midwest for over 20 years.

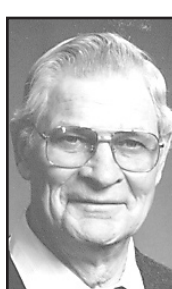
