Area churches will be observing the resurrection of Christ during Holy Week.

The Decatur County Ministerial Association will hold a community sunrise service at 6:30 a.m. Sunday at grandstands at the Decatur County fairground. Area musicians, readings, theater and a short devotion will highlight the event, expected to last about 30 minutes.

This will be the first time that the association has attempted an event on Easter Sunday, but the members said they felt it would be an opportunity for Christians throughout the county to celebrate the resurrection of Christ together as the sun rises over Oberlin.

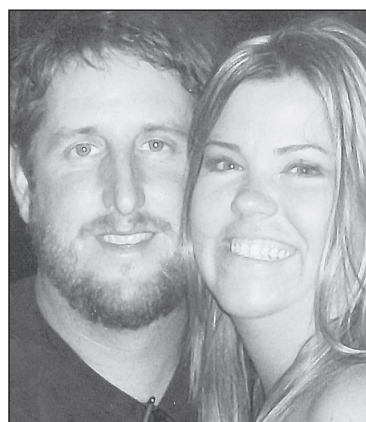
August nuptials planned
