

Runner breaks record

School stat had stood since 1947

Dalton Jones broke a school record that stood for more than 60 years last Tuesday in the annual Oberlin Invitational meet.

The Oberlin boys took third at the meet as Jones broke the record for the 800-meter run set by J. Kennedy in 1947. Kennedy ran the course in 2 minutes, 4.1 seconds. Jones shaved one-tenth of a second off of that with a 2 minute, 4 second run.

Tyler Shields got first in the 1,600-meter and 3,200-meter runs; Dakota Soderlund, first in the shot put; and the 4x400 and 4x800-meter relay teams ran first for Oberlin.

Jones, despite his record-breaking run, took second in the 800.

Phillipsburg won the meet with 2220 points, followed by Norton 176, Oberlin 160, Hoxie and Smith Center, 112 each, Wheatland 106, Oakley 84, St. Francis 78 and Rawlins County 68.
