Girls come in second

The Decatur Community High girls track team came in second at the Class 2A regional meet in Hill City on Friday despite having no first-place finishers.

The Oberlin boys had two relay teams cross the finish line in first place, including the 4x800-meter team, which set a new school record, but was only able to come in sixth in the overall standings.

Those athletes placing in the top four of each event will get to go on to the state meet Friday and Saturday at Cessna Stadium on the campus of Wichita State University.

Schools of all sizes, from Class 1A to Class 6A, will be at the same meet for state track.

Oberlin girls heading for state are seniors Jordan Dreher, Tiffany Anderson and Kiah Blau; sophomores Miki Dorshorst, Cassidy Shields and Darbi Rouse; and freshman Kayla Jones. They will compete in eight events.

Bennington won the girls division with 96 points followed by Oberlin 59, Ell-Saline 52, Hill City 41, Lincoln 41, Oakly 39, Republic County 38, Sacred Heart of Salina 36, Trego Community 33, Plainville 33, Rock Hills 27, Rawlins County 26, Ellis 18, Osborne 16, Solomon 2 and St. Francis 1.

Osborne won the boys side with 87 points, followed by Plainville 65, Sacred Heart 56, Bennington 56, Lincoln 49, Oberlin 47, Hill City 33, Oakley 32, St. Francis 31, Rock Hills 29, Ellis 22, Republic County 21, Ell-Saline 18, Solomon 8 and Rawlins County 4.

Golfers qualify for state

Two Oberlin golfers qualified for state competition at the Class 2A Regional Golf Tournament in WaKeeney last Monday.

Sophomore Kade Brown took fourth place and junior Garrett Berry fifth to win trips to the state meet.

Both players have been to state every year they have played high school golf, so this is Brown's second trip and Berry's third.

The top three teams and top 10 other finishers at the regional

competition were eligible for the state meet at the Buffalo Dunes Golf Course in Garden City on Monday.

The Ellis team shot a 331 for first place, followed by Plainville 342 and WaKeeney 343 to win team berths.

Oakley came in fourth with a 345, followed by Oberlin 362 for fifth, Ness City 368, Ellinwood 370, Atwood 375, Osborne 415 and Hill City 440.

Brown shot a 39-37 for a 76 and

fourth place.

Berry shot 38-39 for a 77 and fifth.
