Lloyd E. Emerson, 90, a native of Decatur County, died Wednesday, June 15, 2011, at the Good Samaritan Hospital in Kearney, Neb.

He was born June 15, 2011, in Decatur County, the oldest child of Charles Solomon Emerson and Gertrude "Inez" (Eagleson) Emerson. He attended rural schools and graduated in 1939 from Decatur Community High School, where he excelled in football and wrestling.

He married his high school sweetheart, Virginia Lou Landau, before enlisting in the Army Air Corps during World War II.

He retired from the Kansas-Nebraska Natural Gas Co. He helped lay pipe in many of the small towns in western Kansas. After retirement, he started a lawn-care business and continued working until his death.

He was a member of the Oberlin American Legion Post.

Survivors include two daughters, Penny Arnoldy, Oberlin, and Nikki and Harve Truskett Longview, Texas; a son, Lloyd Patrick and Nancy Emerson, Lawrence; a brother, Raymond and Patricia Emerson, Rawlins, Wyo.; six grandchildren; and seven great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents and wife; a brother, Robert Emerson; a sister, Alice Hunziker; and three step-brothers, Harold Smith and Ralph and Ervin Emerson.

Services were Monday morning at the United Methodist Church in Oberlin. The Rev. Linda Willey officiated and burial was in the Oberlin Cemetery with military graveside rites by the Oberlin American Legion.

Edith Lydia Pettera, 99, a former cook at the Herndon High School, died June 11, 2011, at the Cedar Living Center in Oberlin.

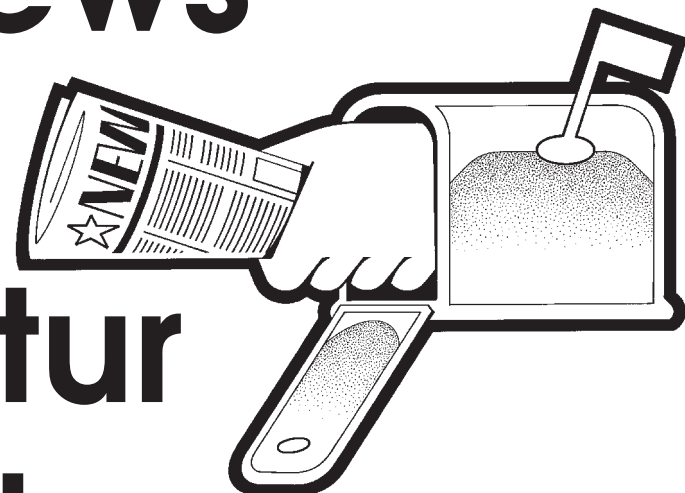
