Audrey R. McVay, 87, Scott City, a former operator of the Fifth Wheel Cafe in Oberlin, died July 11, 2011, at the Park Lane Nursing Home in Scott City.

She was born on Oct. 13, 1923, in Dodge City, the daughter of Leonard and Goldie L. (Nance) Eskew. She married Kenneth Blose in 1940, Alvin Carlson in 1946 and Albert McVay in 1964 in St. Francis. The couple moved from Oberlin to Scott City, where they owned McVay Liquor. They survived a crash in a nine-passenger Cessna airplane in Farmington, N.M.

Her husband preceded her in death on April 15, 1994. Survivors include two sons, Ron Blose, Leoti, and Jim Carlson, Prescott, Ariz., and four grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her three husbands, a brother and two sisters.

Graveside services were Saturday morning at the Scott City Cemetery with the Rev. Jon Tuttle officiating.

Dale James Butler

Dale James Butler, 90, a native of the Norcatour area, died Wednesday, July 13, 2011, at the Decatur County Hospital in Oberlin.

He was born Nov. 8, 1920, on a farm north of Norcatour, the son of Charles Melvin and Nettie Dale (Watson) Butler. He grew up on the family farm, attended the Hudson Pillar School, and graduated from the Norcatour Rural High School with the class of 1939.

He married Patricia Joyce Eicher on April 20, 1940, in Barnum, Colo. In 1943, he entered the U.S. Army and served for three years during

World War II in the Signal Corps with the 70th Division. Following his discharge in 1946, the couple returned to Norcatour, where they spent their summers and wintered in Denver. He was a maintenance man for the Brown Palace Hotel in Denver. In 1985, they made Norcatour their permanent home. His wife died June 6, 1996.

After his wife's death, he helped the Summers with their farming. He was a member of the Lyle United Methodist Church.

He was also preceded in death by his parents; and three sisters, Marguerite Fullerton, Mildred Bryan and Neva Van Otterloo.

Services were Saturday morning at the Enfield Funeral Home in Norton, with burial in the Norcatour Cemetery.

He was born May 17, 1923, in Decatur County, the son of Hugh Cramer and Mable (Beam) Cramer Allen. He grew up on a farm in Decatur County and graduated from Decatur Community High School in 1941.

He served three years in the Navy aviation branch during World War II.

He married Connie West on Jan. 10, 1948, in Oberlin, where they made their home.

During their retirement, they spent 18 winter seasons in Arizona.

He served the City of Oberlin for 40 years as a fireman, councilman, mayor, city superintendent and cemetery sexton. He also operated the Oberlin Locker Plant for 16 years.

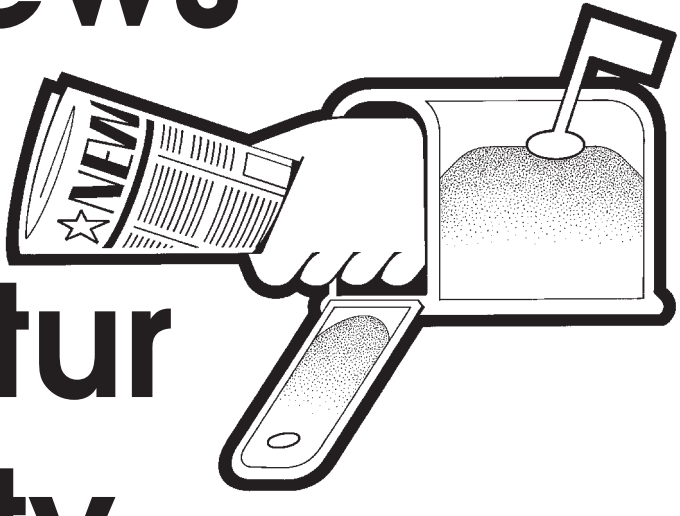
