Grazing acreages approved

Due to the drought across much livestock losses and culling. of the state, federal officials have agreed to allow emergency having and grazing on some Conservation Reserve Program land with established cover.

Adrian Polansky, state executive director of the Farm Service Agency, said farmers and ranchers need to call the county office before beginning haying or grazing. They will need to agree to re-establish at their own cost any cover destroyed or damaged by grazing.

Emergency having and grazing is permitted only based on national eligibility criteria, he said, which focus on the magnitude and severity of the drought and the impact on

Managed haying and grazing or routine grazing is authorized for all counties and is a producer's decision, he said. However, it is only authorized for certain practices and only after the Conservation Reserve Program has been fully established for 12 months.
