Dr. Frederic Richard Reith, 85, a 1944 graduate of Decatur Community High School and a long-time professor at Chico State University in California, died Aug. 30, 2011, in Chico.

He was born July 30, 1926, in Kanona, the son of Richard and Martha (Friedemann) Reith.

The family moved to a farm near Oberlin, where he was reared. He was confirmed in May, 1940 at St. John's Lutheran Church.

He was drafted in August 1945 and served in the United States and Germany during World War II, earning the rank of staff sergeant before his discharge in January 1947.

He earned a bachelor of arts and master's degrees from the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley and later received a doctorate from the University of Wyoming.

He married Connie Sanders on Nov. 26, 1952, at the Federated Church in Oberlin.

He taught and coached at Oberlin Elementary School and also at Trenton, Neb., before they moved to Chico in 1959.

He taught at Chico State for more than 40 years. At his retirement, he was named a professor emeritus.

Survivors include his wife; three sons, Tom, Rick and David Reith; a daughter-in-law, Sunia Reith; a granddaughter; and two sisters, Evelyn and Martin May, and Dorothy Moore, Oberlin.

He was preceded in death by his parents; and a son, Jerry, on Feb. 16, 2007.
