

Couple to wed in fall

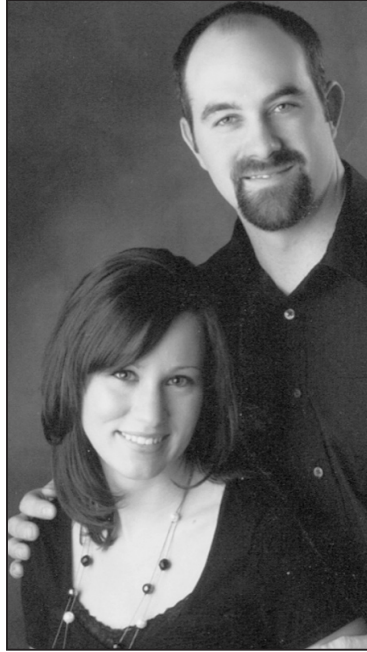
