As store owner Kirk Brown counted down the last 10 seconds to start the three-minute shopping spree, Mrs. Barrett grabbed onto her first cart.

She won the spree during the Decatur County Hospital golf tournament in August. She said she bought 12 tickets for \$10.

Last Wednesday morning, while her husband Jim, friends and hospital Administrator Lynn Doeden cheered her on, Mrs. Barrett filled her first cart and then most of a second.

At the word go, she went to the back of the store, first to the meat department, where she started tossing chicken breasts, pork roasts, pork chops, pork tenderloin, steaks, hamburger, beef briskets, ham and a whole fryer into her cart. The meat just about

filled it to the brim.

Mrs. Barrett grabbed several packages of bacon on her way to the seafood freezer case, where she managed to stack three bags of king crab legs, at \$47.12 each, on top.

Before heading back to the front of the store she stopped to grab two cans of chips and other odds and ends.

Off with the second cart, Mrs. Barrett made sure to get laundry detergent, stain remover and various items she missed the first time through.

Back at the cash register with 10 seconds left, she grabbed boxes of candy off the shelves near check out.

In all, she was able to get \$810.90 in groceries, about \$270 a minute or \$4.50 a second.

The winner said she didn't really have a plan when she came into the store.
