# **Red Devils** roll over Indians in district game

The Decatur Community High Red Devils won their first district football game Friday, beating the St. Francis Indians 27-6 in Oberlin.

The victory takes the team's record to 2-3 after victories over St. Francis and Syracuse and losses to Norton, La Crosse and Cambridge,

"Offensively things have started clicking better for us," said Coach J.D. Johnson. "Defensively, we have stayed strong. The defense has been the backbone for us all year.

"It's good to have the offense successful now.'

The coach said that it was also great to win the first game in district play. It's like starting the year over when you start playing within the district, he said.

On Friday, Oberlin won the coin toss and elected to receive.

Dayton Dreher grabbed the kickoff and ran it back to the Red Devils' 38-yard line. Zach May threw to Kennedy Fortin for another 16 yards and the game was in the Indians territory.

It didn't take long for the Red Devils to take the ball to a third and goal, with just three yards between them and their first score.

Brent Juenemann gave the ball off to May, who ran it into the end zone.

Dreher's kick was good, and with 9:59 left in the first quarter, Oberlin was up 7-0.

The Indians couldn't get the ball across midfield and turned it over after coming up short in a fourth down and one-yard situation. Then, with good field position, the Red Devils went nowhere in four tries and had to punt.

The punt went into the end zone, so St. Francis started at their own 20-yard line.

The Indians moved slowly to midfield. Then, with the ball on the Red Devil 49-yard line, St. Francis junior Michael Leibbrandt grabbed the ball and ran it all the way for the Indians first and only touchdown.

The visitors' two-point conversion try was unsuccessful and with 1:37 left in the first quarter, the score was 7-6 in favor of Oberlin.

Dreher again got the kickoff and this time ran it all the way back to the Indians 49.

It only took two more plays before Juenemann again gave the ball to May, who ran from the 42 into the end zone for Oberlin's second touchdown. A two-point conversion try failed and with 46 second left in moved the ball out to their 30 before the quarter, Oberlin led 13-6.

St. Francis took the kickoff for a long run and ended up in Red Devils territory. However, a false start and delay of game penalties caused the Indians to lose momentum, and they had to punt.

The Red Devils took the ball on their own 20 and moved it to within 10. 10 yards of the goal, but could not make a first down in three plays, so had to give up the ball.

St. Francis took over on their own move the ball and punted after four downs. The Indians' punt only went four yards, and Oberlin took over on the St. Francis 14 with 5:39 left in territory but again had to punt. The the first half.

The Red Devils moved the ball back into enemy territory, but were not quite able to score and turned the ball back over to the Indians on the St. Francis 18.

With about three minutes left in the game, St. Francis started moving the ball. On the Indians' second

Oberlin made use of its good field position to move the ball down field. At second and four, Dreher took the ball in for Oberlin's fourth touchdown on a quarterback keeper.
