Mr. Chambers was born Jan. 11, 1929, in a farm house in Decatur County, northwest of Norcaton in Lincoln Township, the son of John W. and Seltha M. (McIntyre) Chambers. He grew up on the family farm and attended Prairie View School his first four years. He spent the next four years at Rocky Mountain School in Grant Township. He completed his education at Decatur Community High School, graduating in 1947. In 1948, he and Donna McKenna were married. He ran the business until retiring, when he and his wife began renovating and remodeling rental property. Mr. Chambers enjoyed building things for their properties, gardening and digging in the dirt.
