Charles Leibbrandt

Charles Martin Leibbrandt, 62, a 1967 graduate of Decatur Community High School, died Thursday, Nov. 3, 2011, at his home in Imperial, Neb.

He was born Jan. 10, 1949, in Oberlin, the son of Martin and Lois (Moore) Leibbrandt. He was baptized at Peace Lutheran Church in McCook on Feb. 6, 1949, and confirmed at St. John's Lutheran Church in Oberlin on April 28, 1963.

He attended Kearney State College in Nebraska, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Industrial Arts in 1970, a master's degree in Industrial Arts and Marketing Management in 1973, and by August of 1975 had an additional 30 hours accumulated toward a Doctor of Education degree in administration.

He married Diana Guinn on June 7, 1969, in Oberlin and they had

a daughter, Amy Ann, and a son, Chad Martin.

On Nov. 17, 1995, he and Merrilyn Schloo married in Las Vegas.

He taught industrial arts at Chase County High School, served as high school principal and activities director and was general manager of the Far Port Cooperative in Imperial for 10 years.

He owned Marlant Industries Inc. and later worked for the Frenchman Valley Co-op until he retired in July. He was a member of Zion Lutheran Church and the Imperial Rotary Club.

Survivors include his wife; parents; a daughter, Amy and Maurice Johnson, Fountain, Colo.; a son, Chad and Amy Leibbrandt, Imperial; two step-sons, Paul Dawkins, Beaumont, Texas, and Matt Dawkins, Arvada, Colo.; two step-daughters, Janice and Tracy Haaberg, Imperial, and Meghan Parker, Highlands Ranch, Colo.; seven grandchildren; two brothers, Steve and Deb Leibbrandt, and Tim and Terri Leibbrandt, Imperial; and a sister, Kathy and Dave Hult, Gothenburg, Neb.
