# Obituaries

### Benjamin Frevert

Benjamin Richard Frevert, 78, a retired banker and father of Dori Paul of Oberlin, died Thursday, Dec. 15, 2011, in Wilson, from complications of an illness.

He was born on Dec. 8, 1933, in Ellsworth, the son of William C. and Hulda M. (Schulz) Frevert. He was reared in Holyrood and graduated from Holyrood High School in 1952. He served in the Army during the Korean War, stationed in Germany. After returning home, he completed his education at Fort Hays State University, graduating with a business degree.

He married Marilyn Jo Evans on June 16, 1957, in Holyrood. They spent most of their married life in Wilson, where he worked at Wilson State Bank. He was a member of Immanuel Lutheran Church, where he served on the church council; the Wilson American Legion Post, where he was the financial officer for 39 years; the Wilson Lions Club and the board of Wilson Economic Development.

He was manager of the Smoky View Villa and served as a councilman and mayor for the City of Wilson. He was also a member of the Ellsworth County Medical Building, Ellsworth County Economic Development and Bethphage boards.

Survivors also include his wife, Marilyn; a son, Ben Frevert Jr., Fayetteville, N.C.; two daugh-

ters, Daran Frevert, Ellsworth, and Stephanie and David Stoppel, Wilson; and six grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents; a brother, Lloyd Frevert; and two sisters, Emma Burns and Jeanetta Schmidt.

Services were Tuesday morning at the church in Wilson, with Pastor Jim Wagoner officiating and burial in the Wilson Cemetery.

Memorials were established to the church or the American Legion Post. Foster Mortuary of Wilson was in charge of arrangements.

### Lois E. Hussey

Lois E. Hussey, 96, a 1934 graduate of Selden High School, died Dec. 12, 2011, at the Rawlins County Good Samaritan Center in Atwood.

She was born Nov. 12, 1915, at St. Francis, the daughter of Archie and Pearl (Hughes) Carman. The family lived near St. Francis until she was 4, when they moved to a farm near Selden. She attended the Shawl School and Selden High School.

After graduation, she taught for two years at the grade school, and then moved to Goodland, where she met her husband of 59 years, Phay Hussey. They married June 4, 1939, in Clayton and then moved to Goodland. She was a nurse aide and surgical nurse assistant at Boothy Memorial Hospital from 1958 to 1972, then continued as a nurse aide at the Northwest Kansas

Medical Center for 14 years. Her husband died July 20, 1998, and she continued to live in Goodland until moving to the nursing home in 2004.

Survivors include two daughters, Jeanine Rudman, Goodland, and Vereen Cooper, Carbondale, Ill.; a son, Merlin and Susan Hussey, Wichita; seven grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by an infant son, Arlen Hussey; a great-granddaughter, Tristan Rice; two brothers, Alton and Paul Carman; and a sister, Alpha Mae (Carman) Preece.

Services were Saturday at the Koons Funeral Home in Goodland, with burial in the Goodland Cemetery.

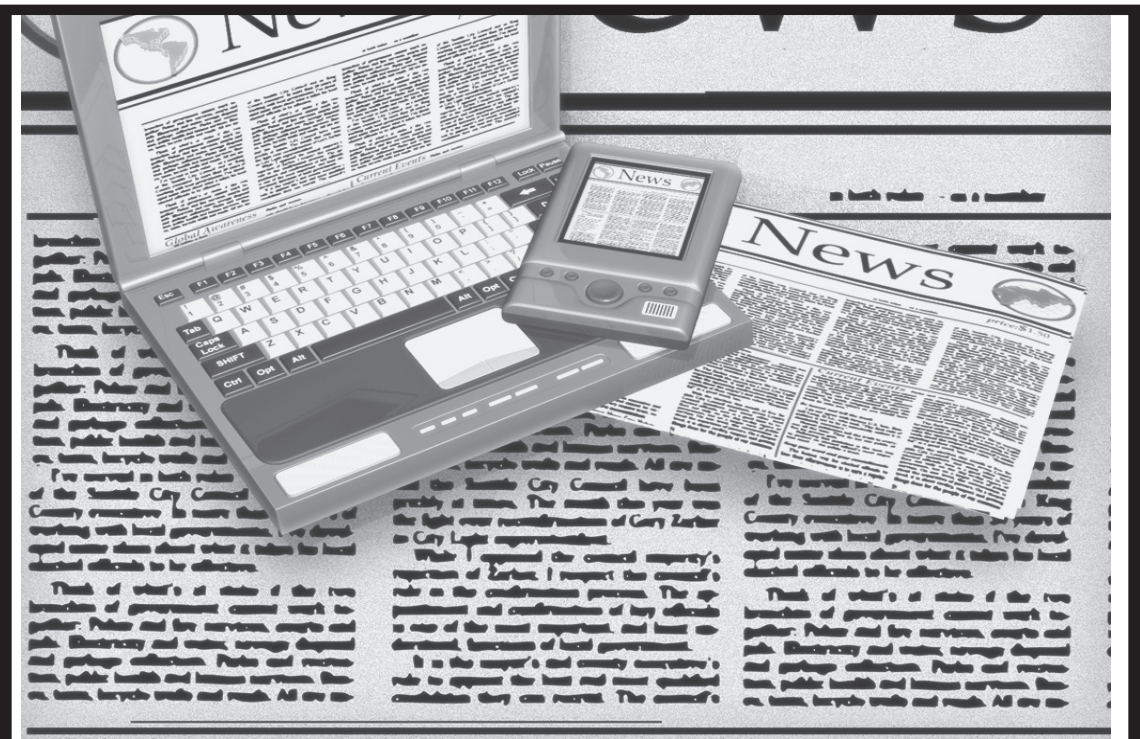
