## Alan D. Addleman

Alan D. Addleman, 79, son of a pioneer family, and a 1950 graduate of Decatur Community High School, died Sunday, Jan. 1, 2012, at the Hays Medical Center.

He was born March 13, 1921, in Oberlin, the son of Theodore Bush and Neva (Russell) Addleman. He attended Oberlin schools, then attended the College of Emporia for two years. He had served in the U.S. Army.

He lived in Estes Park, Colo., where he worked for the Boy Scouts, the MacGregor Ranch and was an ambulance driver. He moved to the Decatur County Good Samaritan Center in Oberlin seven years ago.

His grandfather, D.G. Addleman, was an early settler in Decatur County and bought what became the Addleman Drug Store in 1906. The store was operated by the family for more than 100 years. His son, Ted Addleman, and grandson, Rusty Addleman, were both pharmacists at the store.

Survivors include a sister, Ruth and Robert Ingold, Olathe; a brother, Rusty and Sharon Addleman, Oberlin; seven nieces and nephews; and 13 great-nieces and nephews.

Services will be held at a later date.

## Col. Melvin Huss

Col. Melvin Frank Huss, 82, a Nebraska auctioneer and former manager of the Oberlin Livestock Commission sale barn, died Saturday, Dec. 31, 2011, at Lexington, Neb.

He was born June 2, 1929, at Herndon, the son of Frank and Pauline (Kogl) Huss.

He attended school at Herndon, then worked at the Omaha Stockyards. He attended auctioneer school in Mason City, Iowa, then worked at the McCook Livestock Market and did farm sales in the 1940s.

He married Delores E. Lorens on Aug. 22, 1950, at St. John's Catholic Church near Beardsley. A short time

later, he took over the management of Oberlin Livestock Commission. The couple moved to Lexington in 1956, where he worked for the Lexington Livestock Market and later purchased the business. He received many awards over his lifetime in the livestock industry. He was a member of St. Ann's Catholic Church and the Knights of Columbus in Lexington.

Survivors include two sons, Richard and Mary Huss, Omaha, and Ronald and Shirley Huss, Kearney, Neb.; a daughter, Janelle and Ken VerMaas Jr., Lexington; a brother, Frank and Jean Huss, Herndon; two sisters, Marolyn Hoffman, Gretna, Neb., and Carolyn and Don Warner, Omaha; eight grandchildren, and 10 great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his wife; his parents; two sisters, Helen and Ann, and a great-granddaughter, Silvi.

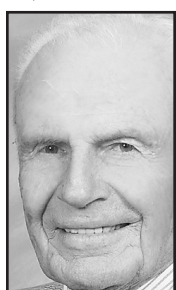
Survivors also include two sons, Philip K. Jorns, Norman, Okla., and Tim Jorns, Overland Park, and nine grandchildren.

# December storm brings rain and wind

How bizarre! A thunderstorm in December.

The storm blew into Oberlin from the north Thursday, accompanied by wind gusts up to 53 mph, thunder, lightning and and rain showers in Decatur and surrounding counties.

Dave Floyd, a meteorologist at the National Weather Service office in Goodland, said it was unusual weather for December, brought on by relatively warm temperatures.

"This March weather helped deliver these thunderstorms," he said.

Mr. Floyd said this warm weather is more like the weather that we would expect in March. It isn't typical for December.

He added that Goodland had such high temperatures Thursday that the

high was 68, a record for the day.

The meteorologist said they don't usually issue thunderstorm warnings in December, but they did for some counties because of high winds.

Decatur County reported winds up to 52 mph at 5 p.m. and 53 mph at 8 p.m., Mr. Floyd said. Decatur County dispatchers said there were no reports of wind damage here. Small hail was reported seven miles north of Oberlin, however.

A storm report on the Weather Service website contained three entries. In Loomis, Neb., just northwest of Holdrege, an empty 60-foot-tall grain bin was destroyed. Norton reported winds of 69 mph and Lenora checked in with 59 mph.
