Oberlin took a 10-6 lead in the first quarter and increased it by outscoring Sutherland 11-9 in the second for a 21-15 lead at the half. In the third quarter, both teams scored 10 and Oberlin still led by six.

In the fourth quarter, however, the Sailors took over, outscoring the Red Devils 23-7 for a 10-point
